In the book of Numbers, chapter 13, we can read about the children of Israel sending spies into Canaan. Most of the spies came back with a bad report, saying that the Canaanites were too strong. Beginning of the Year


STARTING THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

Parking Lot Precautions

Arrival Drop-off & Dismissal Pick-up Procedures


As you know we have a small parking lot, following the correct arrival and dismissal procedures is vital to keeping our children safe.

Arrival: The outside lane is for dropping students off, please do not let any students out of the car while in the inside lane, children must not walk between cars to get into the building, they should follow the path on the outside of the car lane. If you are choosing to come in the building, please find a parking space, do not leave your car in the drop off lane.

Dismissal: Your family will be given a ride call number, if you have not yet received one, please see the front office.

When you pull up into the car line, a staff member will call your number at which time your child will be dismissed from the classroom to get his/her things and come to the car. Please do not ask your child to leave the classroom before his/her number is called. A text from the parent does not dismiss the child. Only when the number is called should the child leave the classroom. When you come to pick up your child, please get in the outer circle and wait your turn. The inner circle is for exiting the car line or pulling around to a parking space only. Be courteous of other parents and do not try to pass others who were there first. Every parent's time is valuable. If your child does not come out quickly, please pull into a parking space to avoid holding up the rest of the line.

Following these procedures will make the process smooth and keep your children safe.


