HydroStorm Advances to Nationals

On Sunday March 25, 2018 the HAA HydroStorm team placed in the top six teams (out of a total of 26 teams) at the Southern Challenge - the regional tournament of the Adventist Robotics League that took place at Southern Adventist University.

Although a completely new team for 2018 (10 students and 4 volunteer coaches), the team has built on the foundation of excellence laid over the past few years. HAA is committed to excellence in educating the students for life today. The Robotics Club is just one avenue for this and it shows how STEM (science, technology, engineering and math concepts) education is highly valued in our school. Besides being loads of fun, our students learn critical thinking and teambuilding skills, basic STEM applications, and even presentation skills.

In 2018 the theme for the FLL challenge

was HydroDynamics - looking at the judicious use of water. In brief, the tournament consists of four categories of evaluation as follows:

Core Values - teams are evaluated on how well they practice the stated values of FLL. Teamwork, Discovery, Inclusion, and Integration are highly regarded. The HydroStorm team received 1st place in this category.

HydroDynamics Project - the students come up with a water related problem and try to solve it. HydroStorm chose to solve the stinky water problem at Camp Akita. They found out that the smell is actually hydrogen sulfide gas and they came up with a "solar paneled filter" that would remove the smell from the water. For their work on this, they received 2nd place.

Robot Performance - teams are given a "field" with 18 different missions and they

have to accomplish as many as possible with their robot in 150 seconds. The robots are built by the students from Lego pieces and they include a variety of electric motors and sensors. The robots are then programmed by the students to perform the different tasks completely autonomously. In this category, our team placed 3rd.

Robot Design - teams are also judged on the design of their robot. Simplicity, durability, programming, automation, mission strategy, creativity, & efficiency are highly scored in this category. HydroStorm received 2nd place in this category. When all was said and done, the 2018 HAA HydroStorm team placed among the top six teams and as a result they are invited to the national tournament taking place the weekend of May 4-6, at Forest Lake Academy in Orlando, Florida.








Illinois Conference Field Day




